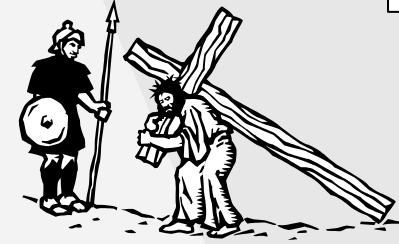


This play was first performed on Good Friday, April 6th 2007 in the Market Square, Warwick.

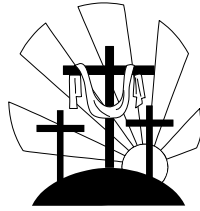

This Passion play is performed in a promenade style, and involves the audience following the action by moving with the actors to the various locations. "The Women" in the play will lead you to the next location and we ask that you do not move ahead of them, as you may find yourselves taking a leading role when you did not intend to!

There will be stewards on hand to guide you safely. Please take care as you walk across the churchyard as the surface can be uneven and slippery. We also ask that you show respect by not stepping on any graves.

At times the audience is asked to join in by calling out phrases that you will see raised on signs, such as "Crucify Him" and "Free Barabbas."

We trust that you will find our portrayal of the events leading up to Jesus' execution a powerful, moving and thought-provoking experience.



Scene 1 A gathering of the Sanhedrin  
(Location: At the 'Bomb Hole')

Scene 2 Jesus is taken to Pilate  
(Location: On the path, leading up to the church)

Scene 3 Before King Herod  
(Location: At the bottom of the Churchyard)

Scene 4 Back to Pilate  
(Location: On the path, leading up to the church)

Scene 5 On the road to Golgotha  
(Location: Inside the Church)

At the end of the performance we ask that there is no applause and that you leave the church in silence so that the atmosphere that we hope we have created can be maintained.
